A NOTE FROM THE COMPOSER

I wrote *Let's Jam* just a few weeks before the Persian Gulf War broke out, as international tensions were mounting. My only experiences in traveling abroad and meeting people from cultures and societies far different from my own were very positive: I made several trips behind the now-defunct Iron Curtain as a member of a choral music ensemble from the University of Miami, and knew firsthand how true it is that music is an international language. Though we could communicate very little verbally, if at all, we shared music and jam sessions that are even now vivid and delightful memories.

As I surveyed the sorry state of a world rushing headlong into war, I couldn't help but think of how much nicer it would be if international relations could take place on a musical basis. If we could trade fours instead of trading artillery fire. If we could concentrate on uplifting the human spirit rather than destroying our so-called enemies. From these ideas came *Let's Jam*, and to make the point musically, the piece begins with no language at alll: just rhythm (the drums), adding a pitched instrument (the bass), and finally singers in a call-and-response exchange of wordless phrases. After the verses and choruses deliver the message, we suddenly launch into a free section of several different musical styles-- classical, gospel, rock, jazz, rap-- as a musical analogy for the acceptance of many different cultures and viewpoints. Finally, every section gets its own spotlight between phrases of the final chorus. To all this, add solos or group improvisations as you like: *jam* is the key word here!

I hope that *Let's Jam* is fun for you to work on and perform, but even more than that, I hope you'll feel that beneath the layers of catchy pop music and clever lyrics is something more meaningful: an attitude of respect and joy towards music and all the people who share this planet. If you have the opportunity to tour foreign countries with a musical ensemble, take it and see for yourself what wonderfully powerful stuff music can be to bring people together. And if I ever have the opportunity to meet you in person-- let's jam!


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
